

PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT FY 2024

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Each year, the financial position of the parish is distributed in the bulletin to all the parishioners for the sake of transparency and disclosure and to show good stewardship on the part of the Pastor, the Staff, and the Parish Finance Council. This past year we ended in very good shape thanks to the continued generosity of our parishioners!

Our Fiscal Year (July 1 – June 30) ended with a total of almost \$19,000 in net operating expenses after the capital improvements and backing out unrealized gains from investments from the total expenses.

Our capital projects included increased campus security by the installation of a camera security system covering the whole campus and regular large cleaning and updating of facilities – roofs, power washing, painting, gutters, appliances, computers, etc.... We also put a new roof on the Chapel of Our Lady of Good Hope. Our charitable giving as a parish is helping Our Lady of Guadalupe parish in Sandhill, Georgia to build a new church. We also continue to support the Social Apostolate (now called Catholic Charities of Savannah), Savannah Care Center, and Second Harvest among other local charities. Our Food Pantry continues to serve the hungry and needy in our community and, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners, received a wonderful level of donations.

This past year we began our *Charging Forward in Faith and Education* capital campaign with the hiring of a Director of Advancement for the Church and School, the forming of our Leadership Committee, and the beginning of the Silent Phase of the campaign. The generous response thus far has been tremendous and encouraging! Thank you to all those who have participated in the campaign thus far!

As we continue the campaign, the Church continues to need offertory and donations so that we can continue the normal operating budget. We replaced three roofs earlier than expected this year because of leaks. Though things will look different this year with the campaign and the building projects going on, please continue your generous commitment to the church through the offertory. Your gift helps us continue our mission – to form disciples of Jesus Christ deepening our faith, hope, and charity as we continue to spread the Gospel and build the Kingdom of God.

I would like to thank our Parish Finance Council – Gregg Schroeder, Griff Lynch, Kevin Dutton, Cindi Vogel, and Marc Friday. Their expertise and advice help me make good decisions on your behalf so that the mission of parish continues with vibrancy!

LAST SUNDAY – OCTOBER 13

Well, we have come to the point of announcements! Sunday, October 13th, will be the last Sunday we will be in the Church! In the week that follows we will begin moving and storing things for our renovation.

Where will we be having mass while work on the Church is going on? Sunday mass will be in the Parish Center/ Gymnasium while Daily mass will be in the Mercy Conference Room. **Confessions** will be heard in the offices of the priests – signs will point the way. **Baptisms** will be held at the Chapel of Our Lady of Good Hope. **Funeral masses** will be held at a local church or the chapel at the Catholic Pastoral Center on Victory Drive.

We will still have access to the **Lumen Christi Adoration Chapel** and the entrance to the Parish Offices from the Narthex. The **Mercy Conference Room** will still be used for some meetings and classes, but at the end of each, it will need to be set up for morning mass. Details are still being worked out.

We might need assistance in **setting up chairs** in the gym for the weekend masses, so be on the lookout for that. Every Monday, two classes from St. James School will come to mass and help put up the chairs afterwards so that the gym can be used for PE class and after-school sports.

Be prepared for more announcements! As I mentioned a few Sundays ago, the word for this year is flexibility and the virtue for this year is patience! We might add another virtue — service! There will be many opportunities to serve as we make this move. This is an exciting time for St. James the Less Catholic Church and School!

Please pray for the success of our Charging Forward in Faith and Education Capital Campaign, for successful fundraising and for the projects themselves!

St. James the Less, pray for us and all our endeavors and plans!






